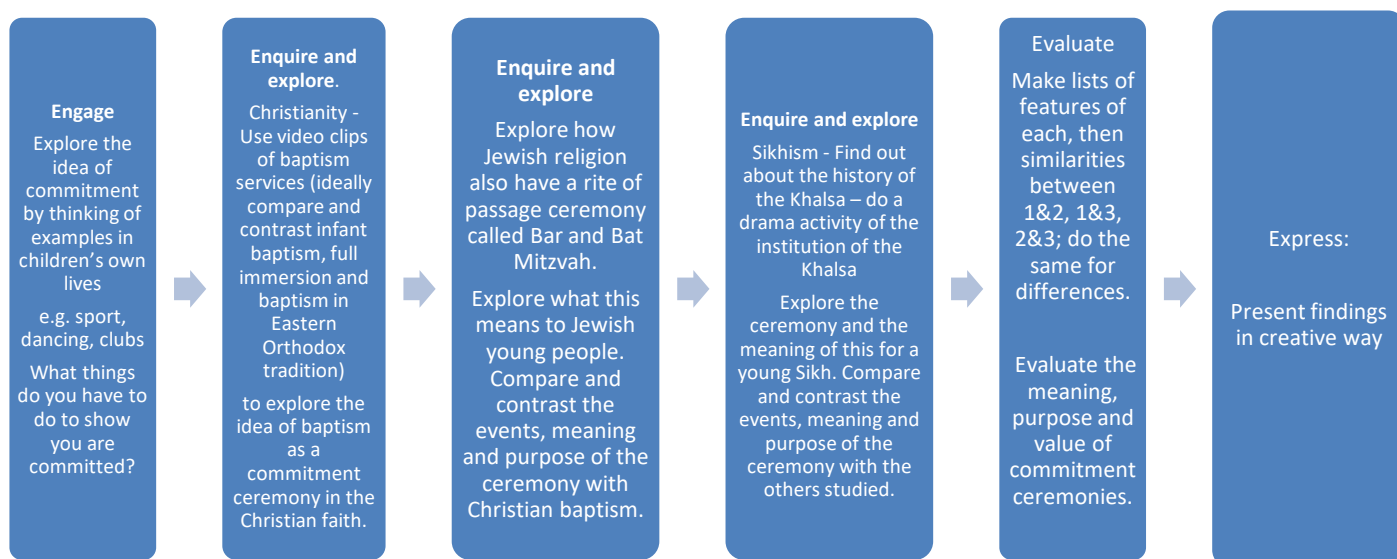


## Year 3 RE – Enquiry 1 – Human and Social Sciences

### How do people express commitment to a religion/worldview in different ways?

This unit focuses on how Jews, Sikhs and Christians show commitment to their faith. Children will look for similarities and differences between them.
