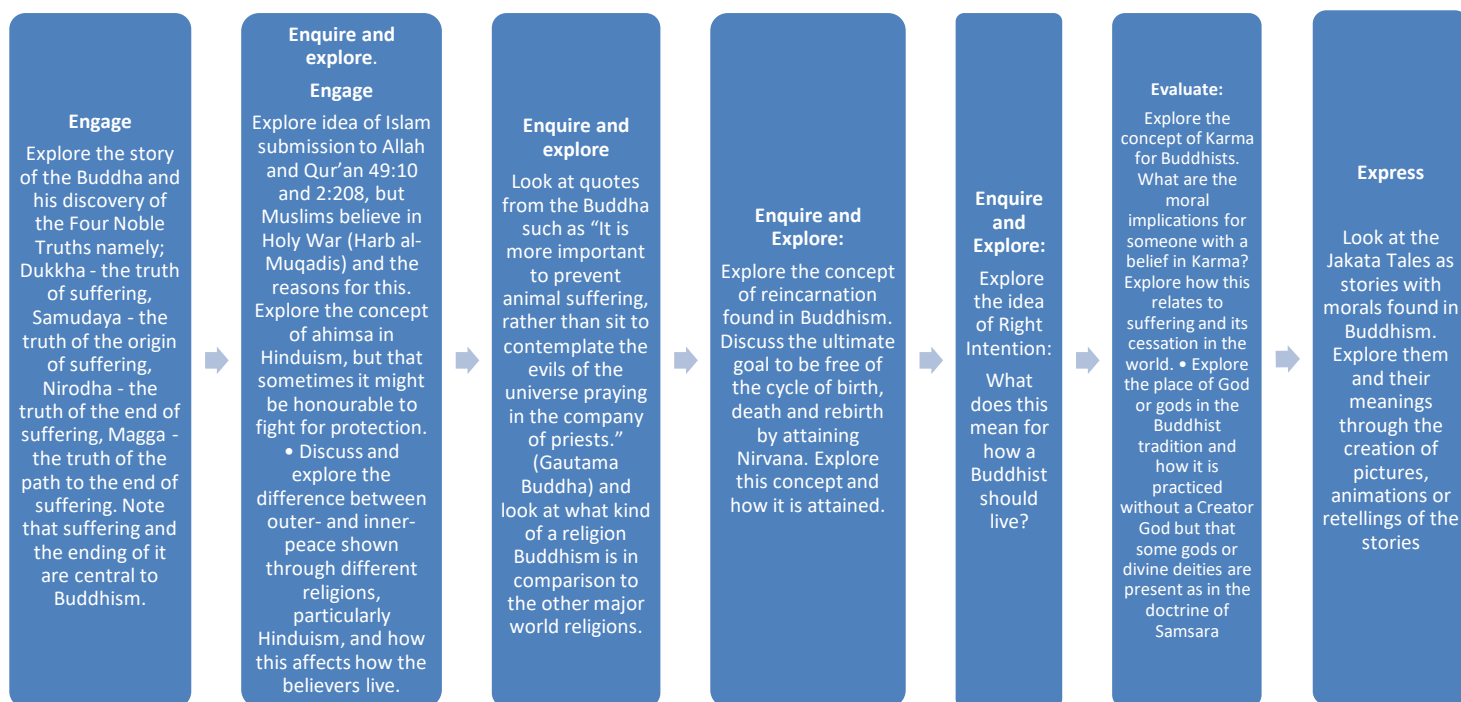


Year 6 RE – Enquiry 2 – Theology

How do Buddhists explain suffering in the world?

This unit looks at the different beliefs about God to Buddhists. Children will explore the Jakata Tales and what is meant by Moral Guidance and implications.



Core learning – what we need to know	
Knowledge – Children will learn....	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ The varying beliefs about God, the Buddha, the Four Noble Truths, the cycle of birth, death and rebirth and the Five Precepts. ✓ The use of Jakata Tales as a source of moral guidance. ✓ The different views about the nature of knowledge, meaning and existence. ✓ Buddhist perspectives on moral issues and consideration of the consequences of action in relation to Karma.
Outcomes – children will be able to ...	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Explain and discuss how beliefs shape the way Buddhists view the world in which they live and how they view others. ✓ Begin to analyse and evaluate a range of different answers to ethical and moral questions/issues, showing an understanding of the connections between beliefs, practices and behaviour. ✓ Begin to analyse and evaluate a range of philosophical answers to questions about the world around them, including questions relating to meaning and existence. ✓ Begin to analyse and evaluate how beliefs impact on, influence and change individual lives, communities and society, and how individuals, communities and society can also shape beliefs.
